#### **MCCA Rate Increase**

I hope you all heard the good news from the Governor's office today, announcing an increase in the base rates for subsidized child care. While more details will certainly follow, here's what we know right now:

- The rate increase will be effective 3/1/2021, so you will see this reflected in your April 20, 2021 payment.
- New providers agreements will NOT be needed.
- You will be able to increase your private pay rates (more details about how later this week). Not sure if ELRC has your current private pay rates? You can view them online either in PELICAN Provider Self Service or on <a href="https://www.findchildcare.pa.gov">www.findchildcare.pa.gov</a> (search for your program name and click on More Details to view your currently displayed private pay rates).
- We are waiting for more details from OCDEL including the actual new rates and how the rate increase will roll out. We will share details with you when we have them.
- Read the full text of Governor Wolf's announcement HERE.

#### **Inclement Weather Reminder!**

Just a reminder if you closed today and/or tomorrow due to inclement weather and have a provider agreement with ELRC 18, you must adhere to the following notification in order for these days to be recorded as paid closures (up to the 15-day maximum):

- If you use PELICAN Provider Self Service, you must enter the closures on the profile page in PSS <u>before</u> <u>March 5<sup>th</sup></u>. Entering the closures on your online invoice will not result in proper payment (and actually takes more work on your part)! Navigate to Provider Profile > Manage Closed Days and enter the closed days. If you need help with this, please contact our Provider/STARS team at (215) 382-4762.
- If you do NOT use PELICAN Provider Self Service, WHY NOT??? (I will spare you my soapbox speech this time, but only because there's SO MUCH information to share with you. You really are missing out on significant benefits, though!) Anyway, if you do not use PELICAN PSS, in order to be paid for these closed days, you must report the closure to ELRC within 3 days of reopening. If you simply report them on your monthly invoice, OCDEL policy requires us to enter them as unpaid closures. You can report the closure by e-mailing <a href="mailto:ELRC18providers@caringpeoplealliance.org">ELRC18providers@caringpeoplealliance.org</a>. Please be sure to include your name, program name, PELICAN provider number (or MPI number) and the dates you were closed. (Or you could just sign up for PELICAN PSS. I'm just sayin'....)

#### Pandemic Relief Award - UPDATE

To date, we have received 1,210 applications for the Pandemic Relief Award (with over 800 of them coming in on January 13<sup>th</sup> – the very first day that the application was available. As a reminder, full details of the grant, which provides a \$600 award to all of your eligible staff can be found HERE. Philadelphia-based providers were

requested to apply using an online application: <a href="https://form.jotform.com/210119006914041">https://form.jotform.com/210119006914041</a>. Use of this online application 1) guaranteed that your application was complete, 2) provided you automatic confirmation that your application was received, and 3) directly entered your information onto a spreadsheet (streamlining the process of getting funding into the hands of providers).

- When your application is processed, you will receive an award letter confirming the amount of your grant and how it will be paid on March 31, 2021. <u>Please be patient!</u> We are receiving several calls and e-mails from providers who have heard of others receiving their award letter. It take time to process these applications, and responding to requests for status update is only delaying our ability to process your application.
- If you need to make changes to your application (other than the total amount requested, which will be based on the number of eligible staff on your application), forward your JotForm confirmation e-mail with an explanation of what needs to be updated to dgetzinger@caringpeoplealliance.org.
- If you applied by fax, e-mail, US Postal Service or hand delivered your application Please await further instructions. You will not need to complete the online application unless your application is incomplete. We will manually data enter your grant information onto the spreadsheet, and it will be processed in the order in which it was received. If your manual application is incomplete, it will be returned to you with a request to complete the online application instead.

## **PPE from ELRC - UPDATE**

By now, all licensed providers in Philadelphia should have received an e-mail from Laura Hollingsworth at Office Basics informing you of the following:

OCDEL has instructed ELRCs to spend remaining Round 3 CARES funding on personal protective equipment and cleaning supplies for child care providers. Your child care organization has been granted a budget to spend on PPE at Office Basics. I have attached instructions and a list of supplies you may purchase.

Please review the attachments to Laura's e-mail for your budget amount and directions on how to order, as well as a price list.

If you did not receive an e-mail from Laura, please check your junk mail folder first and then e-mail <a href="mailto:dgetzinger@caringpeoplealliance.org">dgetzinger@caringpeoplealliance.org</a> with your name and MPI #.

## **Reminder: Round 3 CARES Act**

As a reminder, child care programs which received the Round 3 CARES Act payments were required to complete reporting on the use of those funds. As of Friday, Jan. 27, 2021, 60 percent of programs required to report have successfully completed this requirement. OCDEL and DHS have continued to provide support to programs having access issues to the reporting tool. If you need continued assistance accessing the report and have not contacted been by OCDEL, please submit an email request for assistance to RA-PWELRCQA@pa.gov.

• Please note that OCDEL has approved ELRC staff to be given the security rights to data enter CARES 3 reporting for providers in two limited situations: 1) Providers who have no internet access (as opposed to those having problems accessing the reporting tool), and 2) Providers who are seriously ill. To date, I have submitted requests to OCDEL on behalf of six providers. However, someone has shared the form these providers are using to report their spending, and providers have begun sending their paper form to me. I cannot do this data entry on your behalf without being given the appropriate permissions from OCDEL. If you believe you meet one of the categories about and would like to discuss this further, please call me at (267) 504-4179. Again, this is not meant to be a solution to your inability to use the

data entry tool. I understand how frustrating this process has been for you, and will help you as much as I can to resolve your access issues. You will not be penalized for failing to report due to access issues.

# **COVID-19 Vaccine for Childcare in Philadelphia**

Please be aware that the <u>City of Philadelphia has entered into a partnership with the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia</u> to administer the COVID-19 vaccine for childcare employees, as identified in the <u>City's Schedule of Priority Populations</u> (1b, Childcare, Education providers). The registration of childcare employees will begin next week, and childcare locations will be sent an email to begin uploading roster information on a rolling basis. We expect this process of registering childcare employees who elect to register for the vaccine with the CHOP partnership to be ongoing throughout the remainder of February. As we get closer to the end of February, we will send out a registration form in case any sites did not receive a link for employee registration information. In the meantime, please be patient while the process of signing up takes place.

We understand that there is a lot of information to try and work through this process. For that reason, we are scheduling a townhall conversation about the vaccine and its distribution. Please continue to monitor this newsletter for that discussion day/time/location that will occur sometime in the next two weeks.

# **CCW Rate Increase**

As announced in the last e-bulletin, Governor Wolf has announced <u>an increase in the base rates for subsidy reimbursement</u> effective March 1, 2021. # **Pandemic Relief Award**

February 12, 2021 (YESTERDAY) was the deadline for submitting applications for the Pandemic Relief Award (\$600 for eligible staff in your employ as of 1/1/2021). We received over 1,200 applications and have processed a little more than a third of those. When your application is processed, you will received either an award or denial letter via e-mail (likely within the next week). Grants will be paid on March 31, 2021. Providers will be required to pay out the grant to employees no later than May 31, 2021. # FY22 PHLpreK Procurement, Application, and Timeline Information

The City of Philadelphia Office of Children and Families intends to fund 3,300 quality pre-k seats in FY22. Two applications will be available:

- 1. Renewal Application for provider locations contracted with PHLpreK for FY21, and
- 2. Request for Qualifications for Pre-Qualified Providers. New provider locations. Providers determined to be "pre-qualified" will be on a waitlist to be considered for slot awards for the FY22 program year and will be awarded a contract **only if** reallocation of current FY21 slot allocations is needed.

# **Sprayer Safety Recall**

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission reports a recall for the <u>Victory Innovations and Protexus</u> <u>Electrostatic Sprayers</u>, as the sprayer's rechargeable lithium-ion battery pack can overheat and melt, posing a risk of the product catching fire and/or exploding. Early childhood educators should check if these sprayers were purchased for use in disinfectant procedures.

Unlike most other areas, Philadelphia is currently vaccinating individuals in priority category 1b. This includes child care staff!!!

All DHS licensed child care facilities located in Philadelphia have been sent an e-mail with instructions on how to input employee information for staff who are interested in receiving the COVID-19 vaccine. Please check both your inbox and spam folders for an e-mail from <a href="mailto:covid.schools@phila.gov">covid.schools@phila.gov</a>.

- If you received the e-mail Great! Be sure to respond as quickly as possible. (You can add stragglers later if you are not sure whether they're interested.)
- If you did not receive the e-mail Please fill out a brief Childcare Workforce Vaccine Planning Form (https://form.jotform.com/210547083666055) from the City of Philadelphia. Your information will be forwarded to the Philadelphia Department of Public Health's COVID Schools Team. You will be sent an e-mail linking to a template to enter the contact information for your staff who are interested in receiving a COVID-19 vaccination. Allow at least 24 hours to receive the follow-up e-mail and remember to check your spam or junk mail folder!

This is time-sensitive. The City has a short-term partnership to provide individual vaccine appointments specifically for childcare employees in the month of March. If you have any additional questions, e-mail <a href="mailto:covid.schools@phila.gov">covid.schools@phila.gov</a>. Please be patient, though! Sending multiple e-mails will result in unnecessary delays. (Trust me...I've experienced it! As a group, you all are truly wonderful, just not wonderfully patient! ©)

#### **Reporting COVID Exposure**

Remember that you are required to report all COVID-19 positive cases for children, teachers, and/or staff to both OCDEL Certification and to the Philadelphia Department of Public Health. Please remember to use the centralized form that is shared between the Philadelphia Department of Public Health (PDPH), OCDEL's Bureau of Certification, ELRC 18, the School District of Philadelphia, and the Philadelphia Mayor's Office of Children and Families. # **Subsidy Invoicing for COVID-related Closures/Absences**

February invoicing for ELRC 18 is due this Friday, March 5<sup>th</sup>. If you experienced any COVID-related absences or closures, please remember that current OCDEL policy allows us to pay you for 14 consecutive business days (as long as you have reported the closure – see the paragraph above). In order to make sure that you're paid correctly and that these days do NOT count toward children's annual absences, please remember to mark your invoice accordingly:

- Paper: Write CA for "COVID absence"
- Online: Mark the absence with an A, but indicate in the child comment that the "absence was COVID-related" (click on the case number hyperlink to open the child detail screen to find the comments field)

#### Remember, too:

- Anything beyond 14 consecutive business days will result in the suspension/re-enrollment of children.
- DO NOT charge parents co-payments during a <u>full week</u> of COVID-related absence.

# **Vaccine Rollout for Childcare Providers - PHILADELPHIA ONLY**

All DHS licensed child care facilities located in Philadelphia have now been sent an e-mail with instructions on how to input employee information for staff who are interested in receiving the COVID-19 vaccine. These e-mails were sent to the sites' e-mails used for licensing. You should only complete this form is you are the authorized representative of your child care program who will be responsible for providing contact information for employees at your facility who wish to have the opportunity to register for the COVID-19 vaccine.

After completing and submitting the survey, your information will be forwarded to the Philadelphia Department of Public Health's COVID Schools Team. You will be sent an email linking to a template to enter the contact information for your staff who are interested in receiving a COVID-19 vaccination. Please allow up to 24 hours to receive the follow-up e-mail and remember to check your spam or junk mail folder. If you have any additional questions, please e-mail covid.schools@phila.gov.

# **COVID-19 Vaccine for Childcare in Philadelphia**

Please be aware that the <u>City of Philadelphia has entered into a partnership with the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia</u> to administer the COVID-19 vaccine for childcare employees, as identified in the <u>City's Schedule of Priority Populations</u> (1b, Childcare, Education providers). The registration of childcare employees will begin next week, and childcare locations will be sent an email to begin uploading roster information on a rolling basis. We expect this process of registering childcare employees who elect to register for the vaccine with the CHOP partnership to be ongoing throughout the remainder of February. As we get closer to the end of February, we will send out a registration form in case any sites did not receive a link for employee

registration information. In the meantime, please be patient while the process of signing up takes place.

We understand that there is a lot of information to try and work through this process. For that reason, we are scheduling a townhall conversation about the vaccine and its distribution. Please continue to monitor this newsletter for that discussion day/time/location that will occur sometime in the next two weeks.

# <u>From Certification</u>: Monitoring Coordination Across Dually Licensed <u>Programs and Programs with PA Pre-K Counts and Head State</u> <u>Supplemental Assistance Programs</u>

The Pennsylvania Office of Child Development and Early Learning (OCDEL) has released the Announcement DS 21-01 Monitoring Coordination Across Dually Licensed Programs and Programs with PA Pre-K Counts and Head State Supplemental Assistance Programs. The Announcement clarifies the distinction of and interaction between Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) licensed programs, PDE funded programs, and Department of Human Services (DHS) licensed child care as it relates to program monitoring and or complaint investigation. The Announcement provides information on DHS licensed (certified) programs, PDE private licensed school (also referred to as Private Academic School (PAS), PDE-funded programs, DHS Certificate of Compliance (COC) and PDE PAS licenses, as well as next steps. For details, please read the Announcement DS 21-01 Monitoring Coordination Across Dually Licensed Programs and Programs with PA Pre-K Counts and Head State Supplemental Assistance Programs.

- To submit documents to our eligibility department on behalf of parents, e-mail eligibility@caringpeoplealliance.org.
- To report snow closures:
  - If you use PELICAN Provider Self Service enter the closures in PSS. Navigate to Provider Profile > Manage Closed Days. You have until the 5<sup>th</sup> of the following month to update your closures.
  - If you do not use PELICAN Provider Self Service You must notify ELRC within three business days of reopening after an emergency closure in order for the closures to be entered as paid closures.
